

## All members and visitors are expected to abide by the following dress code.

## Members are responsible for ensuring that their guests adhere to the Clubs Dress Code.

<u>On the Course</u>, neat, conventional golf attire is acceptable while soft spike golf shoes must be worn at all times. The following items of attire are <u>not acceptable</u>:

- Jeans.
- Tracksuits.
- Vests or sun tops.
- Football or rugby style shirts, t-shirts or collarless shirts. (Branded collarless golf apparel is acceptable.)
- Non-tailored, football or beach shorts.
- Sandals, trainers or metal spike golf shoes.

In the Clubhouse, including the Balcony, neat, off-course golf attire or smart casual wear is acceptable.

• Clean and presentable Jeans are permitted.

The following items of attire are **<u>not acceptable</u>**:

- Cut, torn or ragged end jeans or denims trousers.
- Tracksuits.
- Vests or sun tops. (Tailored short sleeved apparel without overt advertising is permitted in the Clubhouse.)
- Football or rugby style shirts. (Branded collarless golf apparel is acceptable.)
- Clothing bearing or implying offensive terms or images.
- Non-tailored, football or beach shorts.
- Golf shoes are not permitted on the upper floor of the Clubhouse.
- Neat and clean trainers are permitted.

The club may, from time to time, decide to issue a waiver to cover one off events. This will be communicated to all members in advance of such an event.

Club staff are authorised to approach members and visitors if the dress regulations are not being adhered to.
